INVITATION TO BID

Sealed proposals for the construction of the City of Marysville, 17th Street Pump Repair Project – 2025 IRWMP, addressed to the City of Marysville, c/o John Mallen, 1204 E Street, Marysville, California 95901, will be received at the office of City Consultant Engineer for the City of Marysville, until **2:00 p.m.**, local time, on **May 8, 2025** and then will be publicly opened and read.

The Work Site is located near Unit 3, the City of Marysville Levee on the north side E. 17th Street between SR 20 and Hall Street. The work generally consists of removal of the existing pumps, inspection of the existing pumps, repairing the pumps as necessary, replacing the bowls on the three main pumps, replacing the nuisance pump, motor, and check valve, reinstallation of the existing pumps, and an add alternative bid of replacing the three main existing pumps instead of rebuilding and replacing the bowls.

Plans, specifications, and proposal forms for bidding this project can be downloaded in PDF format, online at <https://www.marysville.ca.us/bids-rfps> or can be obtained at the Public Works office, City of Marysville, 526 C Street Marysville, California, 95901, for a non-refundable deposit of \$15.00 per set. An additional non-refundable deposit of \$5.00 for shipping and handling is required for those requesting delivery by U.S. mail. Deposit shall be in the form of a cashier's check, personal check, or business check. If a contractor elects to submit a bid, the proposal form shall be on the form the City provides in the specifications or as modified by addendum.

Inquiries or questions based on alleged patent ambiguity of the plans, specifications or estimate must be communicated as a bidder inquiry prior to bid opening. The deadline for submitting questions is **Thursday May 1, 2025 at 4:00 p.m.** Any such inquiries or questions, submitted after bid opening, will not be treated as a bid protest. Please direct questions to or to be placed on the plan holders list by contacting the public works department, (530) 749-3902. A pre-bid site review will be held at the job site on **Thursday April 24, 2025 at 10:00 a.m.** Proposals will only be accepted from contractors represented at the pre-bid site review. Interested contractors shall meet at the project site of the 17th Street Pump Station.

This is a public works project and the contractor's and all subcontractor's employees must be provided certain benefits pursuant to Section 1720 et. seq. of the Labor Code, including the payment of prevailing wage rates if DIR has established prevailing wage rates for the work. The Owner has obtained from the Director of the Department of Industrial Relations the prevailing wage rates applicable to the work. Copies are on file at the office of City Consultant Engineer's Office, and are available to interested persons upon request. Prospective bidders are responsible for determining the applicable wage classifications for this project. (Labor Code § 1773.2.) Payment for the work accomplished will be made monthly, but part of the amount earned will be withheld to ensure performance under the Contract. Substitution of securities for the monies withheld is permitted by the Contract Documents as an option open to the Contractor, pursuant to the provisions of Section 22300 of the Public Contracts Code.

Proposals shall be prepared in accordance with the requirements set forth in the Contract Documents, on the forms therein or copies thereof, and shall be accompanied by bid security in an amount not less than 10% of the amount of the bid. Upon being awarded the contract, Contractor shall provide a 100% Public Works Payment Bond and a 100% Performance Bond.

Except for contractors who work exclusively on small public works projects (defined below), all contractors and subcontractors who bid or work on a public works project must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) and pay an annual fee. No contractor or subcontractor may be listed on a bid proposal for a public works project unless registered with DIR. No contractor or subcontractor may be awarded a public works contract unless registered with DIR. (Labor Code § 1771.1.) Failure of the Bidder to be registered at the time of bidding shall render the Bid non-responsive and unavailable for award. A Subcontractor who is unregistered will not be permitted to work on the Project. If any Subcontractor required to be listed in the Bid is unregistered, that Subcontractor will be required to be substituted with a registered Subcontractor at no additional cost to the City and/or the listing of an unregistered Subcontractor may render the bid nonresponsive. Bidders shall provide the registration numbers for all listed Subcontractors with the Subcontractor Listing Form and registration numbers of all Subcontractors who are not required to be listed not later than 24 hours before they are to start work on the Project.

Small Project Exemption - Contractors who work exclusively on small public works projects are not required to register as a public works contractor or file electronic certified payroll reports for those projects. These contractors are still required to pay prevailing wages, maintain certified payroll records on a continuous basis, and provide them to the Labor Commissioner's Office upon request. The small project exemption applies for all public works projects that do not exceed:

- a. \$25,000 for new construction, alteration, installation, demolition or repair
- b. \$15,000 for maintenance

The Contractor must post all job site notices required by regulation. This project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by DIR. (Labor Code § 1771.4.)

No Proposal will be accepted from a contractor who has not been licensed in accordance with the laws of this State to perform the work herein described and who does not possess a D-21 license or its equivalent for the type of work called for under this project.

The Owner reserves the right to reject any or all Proposals, or any Proposal not conforming to the intent and purpose of the Contract Documents, and to postpone the award of the Contract for a period of time which, however, shall not extend beyond 90 days from the bid opening date.

The Contract time for performance shall begin on the date specified in the written Notice to Proceed and shall extend through **September 30, 2025**.
