**NOTICE TO PROPOSERS**

This Addendum No. 2 forms a part of the Request for Proposals (RFP) and modifies the original RFP documents. All proposers shall acknowledge receipt of this Addendum in their proposal submission.

Failure to acknowledge this Addendum may result in disqualification.

Except as specifically modified by this Addendum, all other terms, conditions, and requirements of the RFP shall remain unchanged.

**PURPOSE OF ADDENDUM**

This Addendum is issued to clarify the intended scope of work, reconcile differences between the RFP and supporting grant documentation, and provide direction to ensure consistent and responsive proposals.

**CLARIFICATIONS**

***Project Intent and Level of Effort***

The City confirms that the intent of this project is to:

Advance previously completed planning efforts into implementation-ready concepts  
Not initiate a new system-wide or corridor-level planning study

The consultant's work shall focus on:

- Refinement of previously identified improvements
- Development of location-specific concepts
- Preparation of conceptual layouts and countermeasures
- Development of order-of-magnitude cost estimates
- Identification of grant-ready and construction-feasible projects

This clarification is consistent with the RFP's stated objective to move beyond high-level planning and toward implementation readiness.

### **Relationship Between RFP and Grant Scope Table**

Proposers are advised:

- The RFP scope governs the consultant's work
- The Grant Scope table is provided for reference and administrative purposes only

In the event of any perceived discrepancy:

The RFP shall take precedence over the Grant Scope table.

### **Study Area and State Highway Facilities**

The study area shall be interpreted as described in the RFP, including:

- Downtown grid boundaries
- State Route 20 (SR-20) and State Route 70 (SR-70) corridors within City limits
- Associated facilities including, but not limited to:
  - E Street (SR-70)
  - 10th Street / SR-20
  - 12th Street
  - B Street
  - Other identified corridors and intersections

References in the Grant Scope table to specific locations (e.g., E Street and 9th Street) are not intended to limit the study area.

## **State Highway Improvements (Caltrans Right-of-Way)**

Proposers shall assume that:

Improvements within Caltrans right-of-way will be primarily conceptual and coordination-focused

Expected improvements may include:

- Signal timing adjustments
- Striping modifications
- Signage and operational improvements

The project does not assume full design or construction of major capital improvements within state highway right-of-way at this stage.

Early coordination with Caltrans District 3 shall be included in the scope.

## **Demonstration / Quick-Build Projects (Task 6)**

Task 6 is clarified as follows:

The consultant shall:

- Identify and develop three (3) demonstration / quick-build pilot projects
- Advance these projects to an implementation-ready level, including:
  - Conceptual design
  - Order-of-magnitude cost estimates
  - Implementation approach
- The consultant shall not be responsible for:
  - Construction
  - Installation
  - Procurement or delivery of materials

Any references in grant documentation to “installation” are programmatic in nature and do not modify the consultant’s scope under this RFP.

## **Level of Analysis**

The City expects:

- Targeted, location-specific analysis
- Focus on priority corridors and intersections

The project does not require:

- Corridor-wide re-planning studies
- Regional traffic modeling unless necessary to support specific improvement concepts

Proposers shall scale their level of effort accordingly.

### **Proposal Preparation Guidance**

To ensure consistency among proposals:

Proposers shall base their scope and approach on the RFP and this Addendum  
The Grant Scope table may be used for context but shall not override RFP requirements

Proposers are encouraged to:

- Clearly state assumptions
- Identify any optional tasks separately

### **Proposal Due Date**

The proposal due date remains:

June 10, 2026, by 3:00 PM

This schedule reflects the re-issued RFP timeline. No additional extension is anticipated at this time.
